### 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday after Epiphany



#### Matthew 4.12-23

Now when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the lake, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali, on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles-the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned.

From that time Jesus began to proclaim, Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near. As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the lake-for they were fishermen. And he said to them, Follow me, and I will make you fish for people. Immediately they left their nets and followed him.

As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them.

Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed him. Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

## **Thought for the Week**

This week's Gospel is packed with information and inspiration. First we learn that Jesus withdrew to have time for himself before he moved base camp, from Nazareth to Capernaum, in order to kick off his ministry of teaching and healing. Then he called the first apostles, who didn't flinch before letting go of their past to embark a whole new path and way of life.

In many ways we may recognise the intensity, which is evident in Jesus' life, from one thing to another in what seem to be a speedy pace. We may not go on a retreat, move house and fish for a new social network in one breath, but our lives are certainly filled with all kinds of activities, reflections, directions and socialising with both old and new friends. And for some life might be exactly the opposite, where the reality of a busy and intense and social lifestyle is missing. Where the longing is to turn that table.

Either way, take time to journey with this Gospel over the week. You may be retreating at this time. You may maybe not physically moving house or town, but shifting focus or moving in a different direction. You may be discerning your calling. And you may identify yourself with one of the fishermen, Jesus very first disciples.

Whatever you feel and wherever you find yourself, remember that you are called and known by God. As it is written in Isaiah: Fear not, for I have redeemed you. I have called you by name and you are mine.

## **January's Retiring Collection – The Motor Neurone Disease Association sponsored by Graham Dale**

There shouldn't really be any need for anything to be said about this devastating disease which has received much recent publicity due to the bravery of now departed sufferers, Doddie Weir and Rob Burrows and the fund raising efforts of such as Kevin Sinfield.

Motor Neurone Disease (MND) is when messages from the nerves known as motor neurones gradually stop reaching the muscles and it leads the muscles to weaken, stiffen and waste effecting how the patient walks, talks, eats, drinks and breathes. Some people also suffer cognitive and behavioural changes. The disease affects everyone differently and not all symptoms affect everyone in the same way or the same speed. MND is life shortening and there is no cure, but the symptoms can be managed to help achieve the best quality of life.

The Motor Neurone Disease Association is the only national charity in England, Wales and Northern Ireland focussed on MND care, research and campaigning. The MND Association with nearly 8000 members provides powerful national and local network that provides information and support alongside fighting for improved services. I'm not expecting you to run seven ultra marathons in a week, as Kevin Sinfield, Rob Burrows great friend, has done; but please give generously.
