2nd Sunday after Epiphany



John 1.29 – 42

The next day he saw Jesus coming towards him and declared, ‘Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, “After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.” I myself did not know him; but I came baptising with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel.’

And John testified, ‘I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptise with water said to me, “He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptises with the Holy Spirit.” And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God.’

The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, ‘Look, here is the Lamb of God!’

The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, ‘What are you looking for?’

They said to him, ‘Rabbi’ (which translated means Teacher), ‘where are you staying?’ He said to them, ‘Come and see.’ They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon.

Thought for the Week

Every Sunday before we enter the space of receiving Christ's body and blood we proclaim what John is proclaiming in this week's Gospel: Jesus is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. It continues with the words "blessed are those who are called to his supper". And we respond with the words: "Lord I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed".

I find the response challenging. At a first glance it feels selective and excluding, even if this is our liturgy and we cannot do much about the wordings. Spontaneously we ask who then decides who is worthy of receiving our Lord?

Maybe we should ponder what it actually says and what has been said before we come to this part in our liturgy. Because we are all invited and we are all called and we are all worthy.

In the institution we hear the words: Do this in remembrance of me. And this is what we do, week in and week out. We remember our Lord, the Lamb of God, who took us and all our imperfection on his shoulders so we could live. And Christ has spoken and we are healed through him. Remember the crossing of your forehead from last week. Christ claims you for himself. That is to be worthy.

The Lamb of God who says: come to me and I shall give you rest. I don't give you what the world gives. I give you me. Because I love you.

There shouldn't really be any need for anything to be said about this devastating disease which has received much recent publicity due to the bravery of now departed sufferers, Doddie Weir and Rob Burrows and the fund raising efforts of such as Kevin Sinfield.

Motor Neurone Disease (MND) is when messages from the nerves known as motor neurones gradually stop reaching the muscles and it leads the muscles to weaken, stiffen and waste effecting how the patient walks, talks, eats, drinks and breathes. Some people also suffer cognitive and behavioural changes. The disease affects everyone differently and not all symptoms affect everyone in the same way or the same speed. MND is life shortening and there is no cure, but the symptoms can be managed to help achieve the best quality of life.

The Motor Neurone Disease Association is the only national charity in England, Wales and Northern Ireland focussed on MND care, research and campaigning. The MND Association with nearly 8000 members provides powerful national and local network that provides information and support alongside fighting for improved services. I'm not expecting you to run seven ultra marathons in a week, as Kevin Sinfield, Rob Burrows great friend, has done; but please give generously. Walsingham Mass Diary Dates for 2026


