It is hard to believe that we are nearing the end of the year and will soon be preparing for the season of Advent. At the beginning of the school year Sue and Roubina received requests from Bishop Perrin (BP) and Heathfield (infant and Junior) schools to continue with Fr John's work and hold assemblies in church as well as visiting the schools. Working with Joanna Jones, Kensington Area Bishop's Schools' Chaplain, so far we have organised and held 7 assemblies for BP year 1 to year 6 children on topics such as friendship and reverence, welcoming some 150 children and their teachers. We also visited Heathfield schools on two occasions talking about Harvest and discussing our favourite parables and hearing about theirs. We have also welcomed 120 Heathfield year 4 children and their teachers to a treasure hunt in church.

The Tic Toc Nursery in Staines Road visited us with their harvest gifts for the food bank and heard from us about harvest and why it is celebrated

Further school visits are planned for the rest of the year and for the Spring term. Additionally we will be welcoming Waldegrave and BP to St Augustine's for their annual Christmas concerts.

As we reflect on this day, Safeguarding Sunday, we recognise this has been a hugely traumatic week for survivors of abuse as well as many of you. The publication of the Makin Review exposed abhorrent abuse and the Church's wholly inadequate response, and it was followed by the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury.

Those victims and survivors of abuse are foremost in our prayers. Over recent years, together we have been working to make our parishes a safer place for all, and to learn the lessons from past failures. As we look ahead and recognise the significant practice improvements made, we should do so without complacency and remain alert to the risk of any form of abuse. Let us continue to respond well to safeguarding concerns and ensure our preventative arrangements are the best they can be. Let us continue to love and support each other as we continue to strive for an even safer Church. Best wishes.
