

A Word from the PCC

Fr John officially vacated his position at the end of July and the process to appoint our new vicar commenced in September when the wardens held a meeting with Rev. Rust who explained what happens in a vacancy.

The following steps have already taken place. Firstly, as required by the diocese, the PCC attended an Unconscious Bias training, to ensure the incumbent's appoint is made without any prejudice. Secondly, a pre-Section 11 meeting was held, attended by the PCC members and chaired by Rev. Rust, who explained the process of appointing the next incumbent.

Royal National Lifeboat Institution (RNLI)



The Royal National Lifeboat Institution celebrates its 200th anniversary this year. The crew members are all volunteers coming from different walks of life. They can be summoned by their pagers at any time of the day or night to go on a rescue

mission. This could be to a swimmer, kayaker, paddle boarder, sailor or fishing vessel that has got into difficulties. Or sometimes even to an animal. The sea can be very treacherous and unpredictable.

The RNLI does not only operate along the coast. Closer to home there are 4 lifeboat stations along the Thames, including one in Teddington, ready to rescue anyone who has got into difficulties in the water. Rivers can also be highly dangerous.
