John 2.1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.'

Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it.

When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

January Retiring Collection - UNICEF

On 6th January we celebrate 12th Night, with the coming of the three wise men who brought gifts for the baby child Jesus.



This month our retiring charity is UNICEF, an international charity that provides support for children in all parts of the world. Working in over 190 countries they respond to emergencies, such as that seen in Gaza, Haiti, the Sudan and Ukraine; to poverty and hunger as seen in Yemen and Syria. UNICEF report that 2024 has been very difficult and there are now around 1 billion children living in poverty, which means they lack basic necessities such as food, water, shelter and education – all things that we take for granted.

Of these children, 333 million live in extreme poverty surviving on less than £1.75 per day. We know that most of these children live in parts of Africa, but please don't let this hide the fact that we also have children in wealthy countries, such as England, who live in extreme poverty.

This month I hope that you will follow the Christmas story and help the children in greatest need by donating as generously as you are able to UNICEF.
