

**4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent – Mothering  
Sunday**



Jesus on the Cross:

“He said to his mother, ‘Woman, here is your son.’ And to the disciple, ‘Here is your mother.’” (John 19:26-27)

Mothering Sunday falls on the fourth Sunday in Lent, exactly three weeks before Easter Sunday. Celebrated (since the Middle Ages) in the United Kingdom, Ireland and some Commonwealth countries, Mothering Sunday marked a day when Christians visited their mother church — the church in which they were baptised, and thus became "a child of the church".

Today, Mothering Sunday has largely become a Sunday we honour Mothers and Women generally for their role in being pillars of families and communities. We wish mothers and all women a very happy and blessed Mothering Sunday.

## First Reading – Exodus 2.1-10



Now a man from the house of Levi went and married a Levite woman. The woman conceived and bore a son; and when she saw that he was a fine baby, she hid him for three months. When she could hide him no longer she got a papyrus basket for him, and plastered it with bitumen and pitch; she put the child in it and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen to him.

The daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river, while her attendants walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her maid to bring it. When she opened it, she saw the child. He was crying, and she took pity on him. 'This must be one of the Hebrews' children,' she said. Then his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter, 'Shall I go and get you a nurse from the Hebrew women to nurse the child for you?' Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Yes.' So the girl went and called the child's mother. Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Take this child and nurse it for me, and I will give you your wages.' So the woman took the child and nursed it. When the child grew up, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and she took him as her son. She named him Moses, 'because', she said, 'I drew him out of the water.'

And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.


### **Revision of the Electoral Roll**


