Charity number 1134957 the True Cross, is an old tradition in both the Orthodox and Roman Catholic church, also picked up in our Anglican church. It is believed that the cross from the crucifixion was found and then brought to the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem in September in the 4th century, hence the season.

It is always good to remind ourselves of the significance and meaning of a symbol that we might not ponder very much but take for granted. The cross. The symbol of hope and redemption. The sign of the empty cross reminding us that Christ did die for us so that we can live for ever in union with Him. It is also the symbol of spiritual strength. How often do we not touch the cross if wearing a necklace, when we feel in need of support, help or guidance? The cross is there to remind us of a life in humility, love and prayer. Of healing and hope. And of a God that loves us beyond what we can understand. That's always worth celebrating!
