

#### Luke 18.1-8

#### **Thought For the Week**

In the gospel of this week Jesus is teaching his followers, and us, to be persistent in our prayers and not become discouraged if we don't experience an immediate answer according to our own will and wishes. Life is not perfect even though we pray and trust in God. Life still involves disappointment, loss, and injustice, which gives us reasons to lose hope. When prayers go unanswered for a long time, it can feel as if they are pointless. But they are not!

Continuous prayer demonstrates our trust in God's willingness to hear us, even when it feels like nothing is happening. It's a way to remain in communion and relationship with God. And God does listen. Remember what the Psalmist writes: "Even before a word is on my tongue, you know it already". Persistence in prayer may not immediately change our circumstances, but it does change us. It deepens our relationship with God. God is there, already knowing what is in our hearts.

We may have our own time and economy when we come before God that we forget that God's timing is perfect. While we pray for justice according to our own schedules, the parable reminds us to trust in God's perfect and loving timing. God will grant justice from a divine perspective that may look different from our viewpoint. Keep speaking with God but don't forget to let God speak to you!
