

# **Update from the APCM**

At the APCM meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> May, a question was raised about the reading of the names recorded in our Year's Mind Book during prayers on Sundays. Visiting clergy, including the Archdeacon and members of the congregation have commented on this practice stating that we should try to keep our prayers short and focused. We therefore put forward the following proposal:

The names on the years mind will no longer be read out each Sunday, instead

- It will be included in the printed weekly newsletter (current practice)

- It is in the remembrance book for the specific date (current practice)
- It is included in the All Souls Day prayers if a request is made (current practice)
- It will be on the screen during the intercession prayers
- If any of our parishioners wish to have the name of their loved one remembered in the week of their anniversary, they can ask one of the churchwardens or the sacristan

The above was discussed during the meeting and it was decided to consult the wider community before implementing the proposal.
