A Word from the Vicar

"Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or are you envious because I am generous?"

On face value the landowner in the Gospel story comes across as an unfair employer who exploited the workers who worked long hours.

However, this story is about the generosity of God, the generosity of God that is beyond human fairness, and where:

- all receive the same reward, the same amount of God's generous love,
- every person has the same value, the status we give to others or ourselves does not count,
- all are equal, both nobles and commoners have a seat at the same one table.

Here, no one is too late, no one is unworthy, and no one is on their own because God does care and wants everyone to get the same full benefits of His generous love.

This is a call to how we must treat others, with the Devine generosity that equalises, because before God we are recipients of God's generous gift of love that none of us deserves, and yet God treats us as if we deserve. Amen.
