The Visit of the Wise Men

"On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." – Matthew 2.11

The 1st Sunday of Epiphany (Baptism of Jesus)

The Feast of the Epiphany marks the end of the Christmas season and is celebrated on 6th January. Epiphany is a celebration of God manifesting as the baby Jesus and revealing Himself to the world. It is the time when we remember one element in the story of Christ's birth, the visit of the magi (also called the Three Kings or Wise Men). This is an important day signifying that Jesus' birth would be important for all people, not just the Jews; He is both 'a light to lighten the Gentiles' and 'the glory of God's people Israel'.

The season of joyful celebration now continues through the successive Sundays of Epiphany and ends with the Feast of the Presentation (Candlemas).

January Retiring Collection – Richmond Young Carers



Young carers are children and young people under the age of 18 who act as carers for a member of their family. These young people offer physical and emotional support to someone in their family who

cannot manage without their help. This means that often they are not able to join in activities with their peers, they have less time to focus on homework, and they may have disturbed sleep. Their own emotional wellbeing may be affected.

The Richmond Young Carers Centre is a charity which supports young supporters by offering advice, information and emotional support. They also offer mentoring programmes, holiday activities, after school groups, peer support etc. This support gives the young people more confidence, they feel more positive, safe and listened to, and they have fun.

Richmond Young Carers Centre is delighted and grateful that St Augustine's Whitton is raising funds for them this January, saying "we cannot thank you enough for thinking of our service supporting young carers and their families".
