Epiphany



The Feast of the Epiphany marks the end of the Christmas season and is celebrated 12 days after Christmas on 6th January. Epiphany is a celebration of God manifesting as the baby Jesus and revealing Himself to the world.

The word 'epiphany' comes from the Greek language and means 'to show forth'. It is the time when we remember the day the Magi (also called the Three Kings or Wise Men) visited baby Jesus in Bethlehem; when Jesus was 'to show forth' as God's Son to non-lews

This is an important day signifying that Jesus' birth would be important for all people, not just the Jews. Jesus is both 'a light to lighten the Gentiles' and 'the glory of God's people Israel'.
