The Wedding at Cana

(The Wedding Feast at Cana (1562 - 1563) – by Paolo Veronese)
"Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them
up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to
the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the
water that had become wine, and did not know where it came
from" – John 2.7-9

Epiphany is a celebration of God manifesting as the baby Jesus and revealing Himself to the world. It is the time when we remember one element in the story of Christ's birth, the visit of the magi (also called the Three Kings or Wise Men). This is an important day signifying that Jesus' birth would be important for all people, not just the Jews; He is both 'a light to lighten the Gentiles' and 'the glory of God's people Israel'.

The season of joyful celebration now continues through the successive Sundays of Epiphany and ends with the Feast of the Presentation (Candlemas).

Second Reading – Revelation 19.6-10



Gospel Reading - John 2.1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.
