Ascension and Pentecost

This month we will be celebrating Ascension and Pentecost Feast days.

On the 40th day after Easter, we celebrate Jesus Christ's ascension into Heaven. On this day Jesus commissioned his disciples to continue his work and promised them the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The day of Pentecost marks fifty days since Easter Day and brings the Easter season to an end, but we continue to be Easter people throughout the year. Pentecost recalls how God's Holy Spirit poured upon the disciples after Jesus' ascension, empowering them to begin the work of making disciples of Jesus in every nation.
