Jesus Calls Philip and Nathanael

Jesus answered, 'Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than these. And he said to him, 'Very truly, I tell you, you will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man."—John 1.50-51

Epiphany, celebrated on 6th January, marks the end of the Christmas season. Epiphany is a celebration of God manifesting as the baby Jesus and revealing Himself to the world. It is the time when we remember one element in the story of Christ's birth, the visit of the magi (also called the Three Kings or Wise Men). This is an important day signifying that Jesus' birth would be important for all people, not just the Jews; He is both 'a light to lighten the Gentiles' and 'the glory of God's people Israel'.

The season of joyful celebration now continues through the successive Sundays of Epiphany and ends with the Feast of the Presentation (Candlemas).
